Seeing Healthy Start Through the Eyes of the Parents Nyleah and Lennox Willis

Nyleah Willis first learned about Healthy Start when she was 17 and pregnant with her first child in Jackson County. Healthy Start helped her through being a teen mom. When she became pregnant with her son, she filled out the screening form at Emerald Coast OB/GYN and soon met with Casey at Healthy Start. She found the process easy for her to get involved with the program.

As a parent, Healthy Start was very helpful to her with the dos and don'ts of caring for an infant. It also helped her know what the latest changes were to raising a newborn. She currently has an 11 year old, 5 year old and an infant, and has learned that things change quickly when it comes to babies and safety. It helped having someone to guide her and help make sure she is doing what is best for her baby.

Her favorite part about being with the program is learning new tips, and she loves having someone to check on her, not just her baby. It helps her mentally to know there is someone there for her.

When asked about her husband's involvement in the Fatherhood Program, Nyleah said that he loves it. He looks forward to his Thursday meeting every week. She expressed that sometimes men can be clumsy and unsure with babies, but since participating in the Fatherhood program Lennox has become more comfortable with the baby and more confident in his parenting skills. It has been wonderful to see him enjoying being a dad!

Nyleah has been married to Lennox since June of this year. He has lived in Panama City for two years. Lennox has seven children, five biological and two stepchildren. He claims them all as his own, however.

Lennox got involved with the T.E.A.M. Dad Fatherfood program while at a Healthy Start Baby Shower event that he attended because his wife was involved in the Healthy Start Program. He found it was easy to get involved, and realized men also need some guidance on being a father, as well. He also found it easy to join in and express his feelings to someone who wasn't judgmental and could help him be a better father.

Lennox also discovered that the Fatherhood



Program has been good for his home life. He's seen improvements on how the way he approaches things now, and has learned a lot of pointers on taking care of himself first, to make sure everyone else is okay. He has also learned the importance of making sure he and Nyleah make decisions as partners.

Looking back, Lennox most definitely sees things he would have done differently with his older children, had he known the things he has learned from the program. For example, he wishes he'd known that babies communicate through crying and they just don't cry for no reason. It's definitely a learning process and he's glad he's doing it better now.

The thing Lennox enjoys most about being a father is the smiles that his children give him and the love they show for him. His favorite part about being involved with T.E.A.M. Dad is learning to be a better father, especially in the areas he didn't know about in the past.

October is SIDS Awareness Month

More than one third of deaths in infants occur due to Sudden Unexpected Infant Deaths each year according to the National Institute of Health. Unsafe sleep is the leading cause of infant death.
